Our elementary school is definitely busy and off to a great start this year. Our community night back in August was once again a wonderful opportunity for families to visit our elementary classrooms to meet their child's new teacher and drop off supplies. Kindergarten staggered start proved to be our best schedule yet. We also decided this year to delay entrance screenings/testing on all students grades 1-4 until after our third day of school. This allowed teachers the opportunity to get to know their new students, establish routines, and do some fun activities. It also allowed students to settle back into the routine of coming to school each day without feeling overwhelmed.

Once teachers completed beginning of the year screeners, they were able to use the data to plan for small group and individualized instruction. It wasn't long before teachers had Heggerty Phonemic Awareness, 95% Phonics, Wonders, and REVEAL Math in place.

Grandparents luncheons were held in September and October and once again we were very excited to welcome our grandparents into our school and spend time with their grandchildren in their school day environment.

Throughout the year we will celebrate students who were recognized by their teachers for various character traits. For August/September we celebrated our PAX Leaders as those students showing *Helping Hands* with their classmates.

Our parent teacher conferences will be held Thursday, October 17 and Tuesday, October 22. This is a great opportunity for parents to sit down with their child's teachers to discuss overall progress. Teachers will have valuable data and information to share.

We are also excited to recognize students who have missed only two or fewer days during the first nine weeks of school. Attendance is very important to us as good attendance begins at a very young age. Our goal is to have productive collaborations between family and school.
